## PAPER DOLLS WITH HOUSES

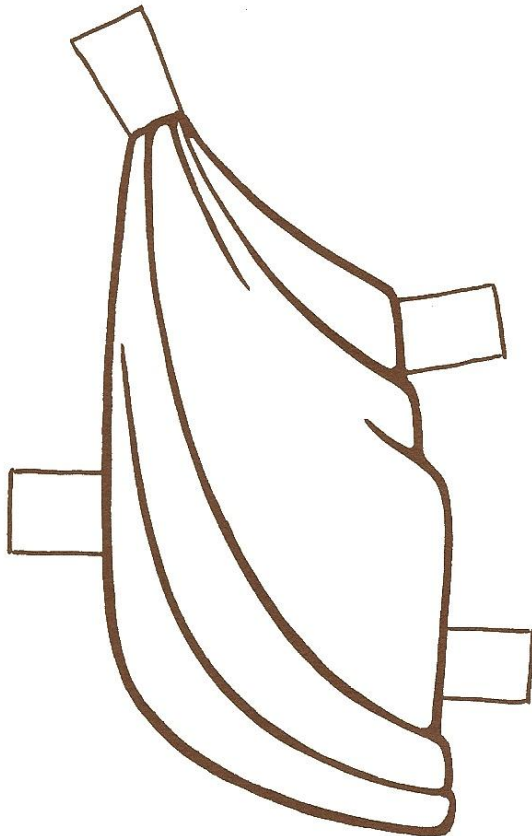

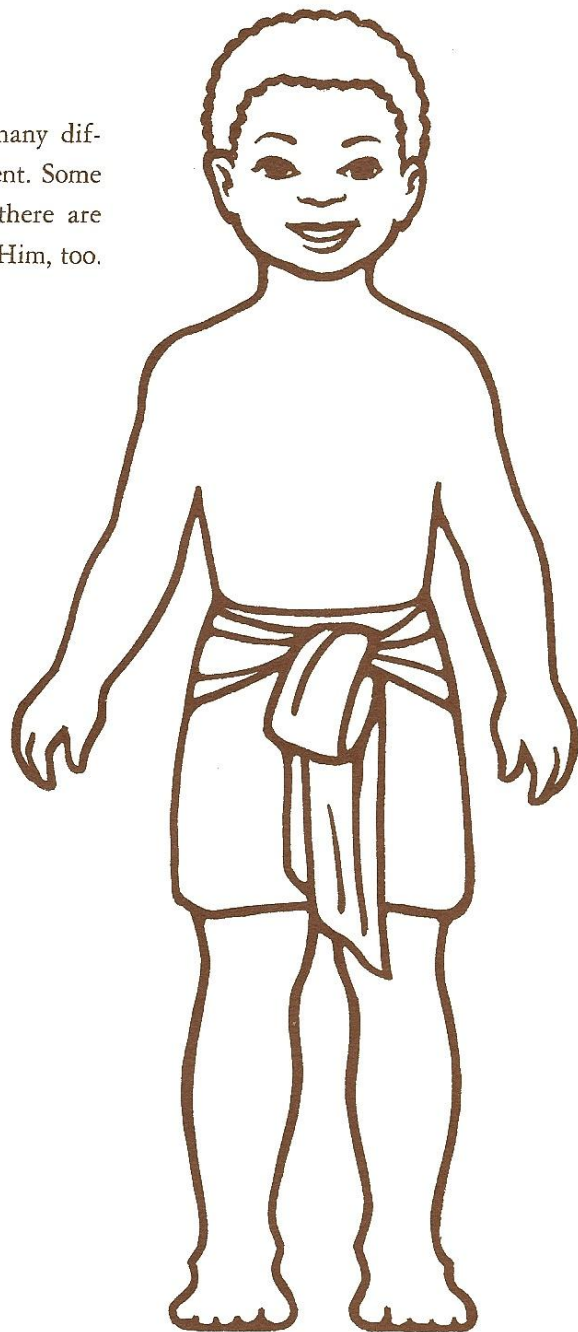

*Cut slot along dotted lines on shield. Cut out and slip the strip above through the slots. This will form a handle on the back of the shield so that Nukaru can hold it.*



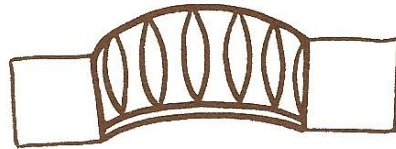
Nukaru's father made this necklace for him.

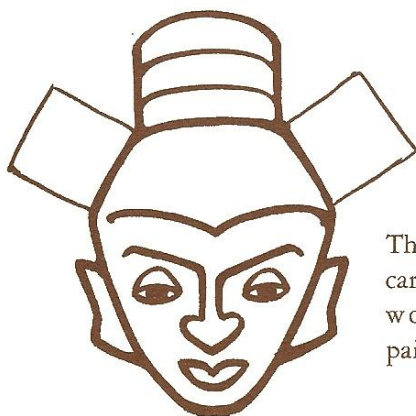

This mask is carved out of wood, and painted.



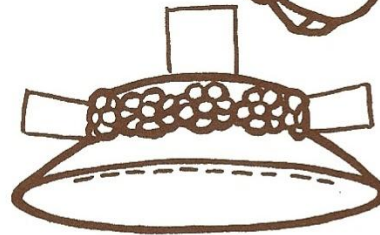
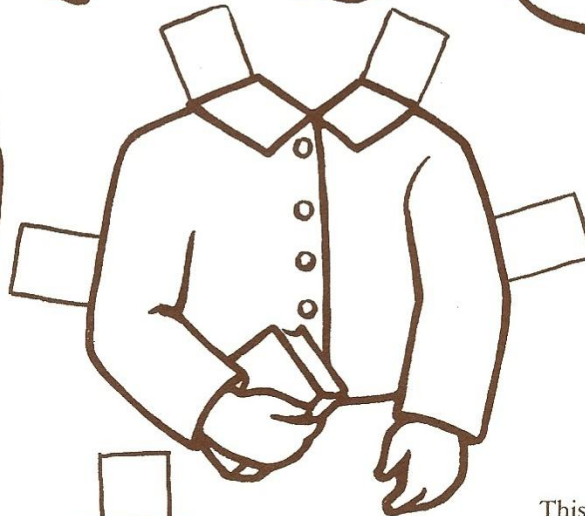
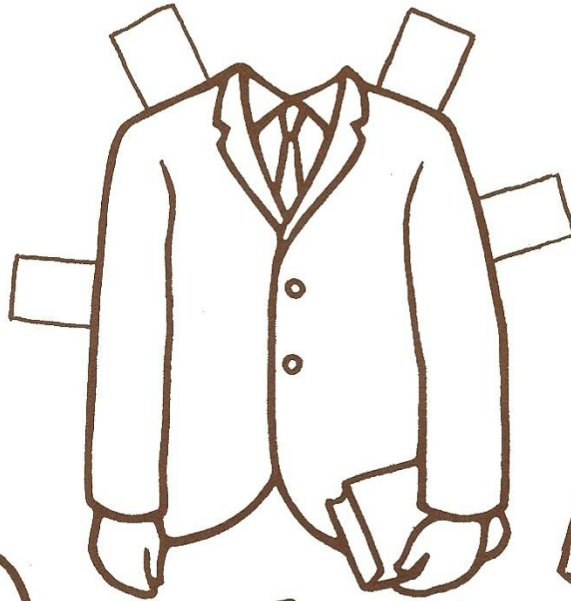
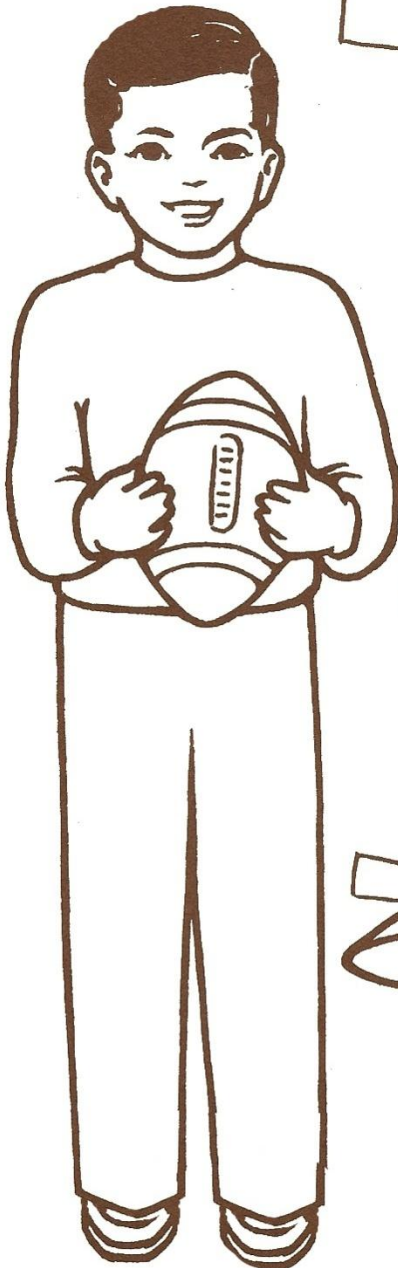
Nukaru lives with his family in a small hut made of branches, reeds and long grass. He spends most of his time out of doors. *Cut out and stand in its place on the map.*

This is Jim, who lives in the United States.



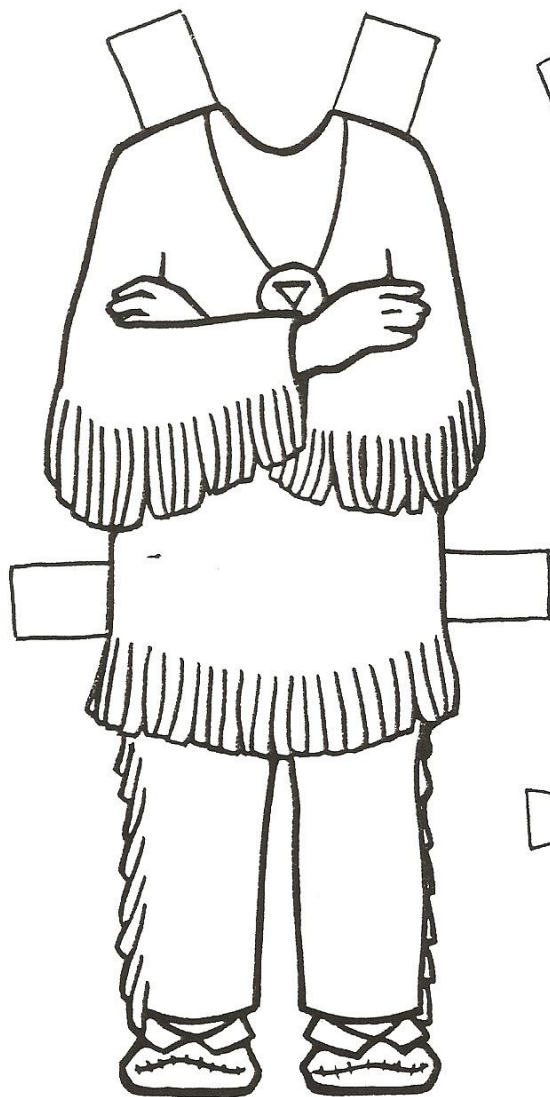
This is Jane. Jim and Jane dress up to go to Church and Sunday School.



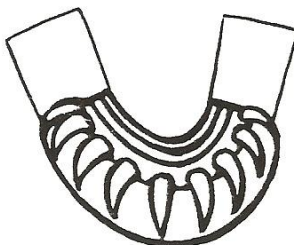

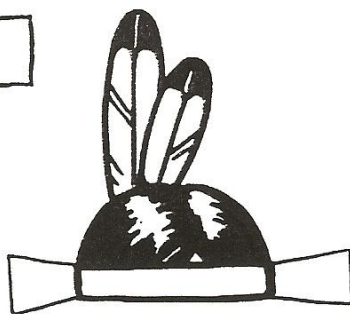
The AMERICAN INDIANS live on reservations in many different places in the United States. Many of the Indian people don't know Jesus and his love for them.



Swift Runner has a leather suit just like his father's.



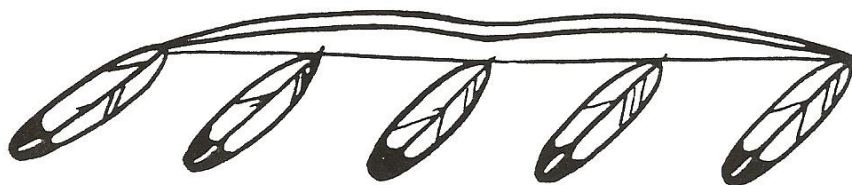
Swift Runner's necklace is made of the teeth of wild animals.



Swift Runner likes to wear his head band and feathers.

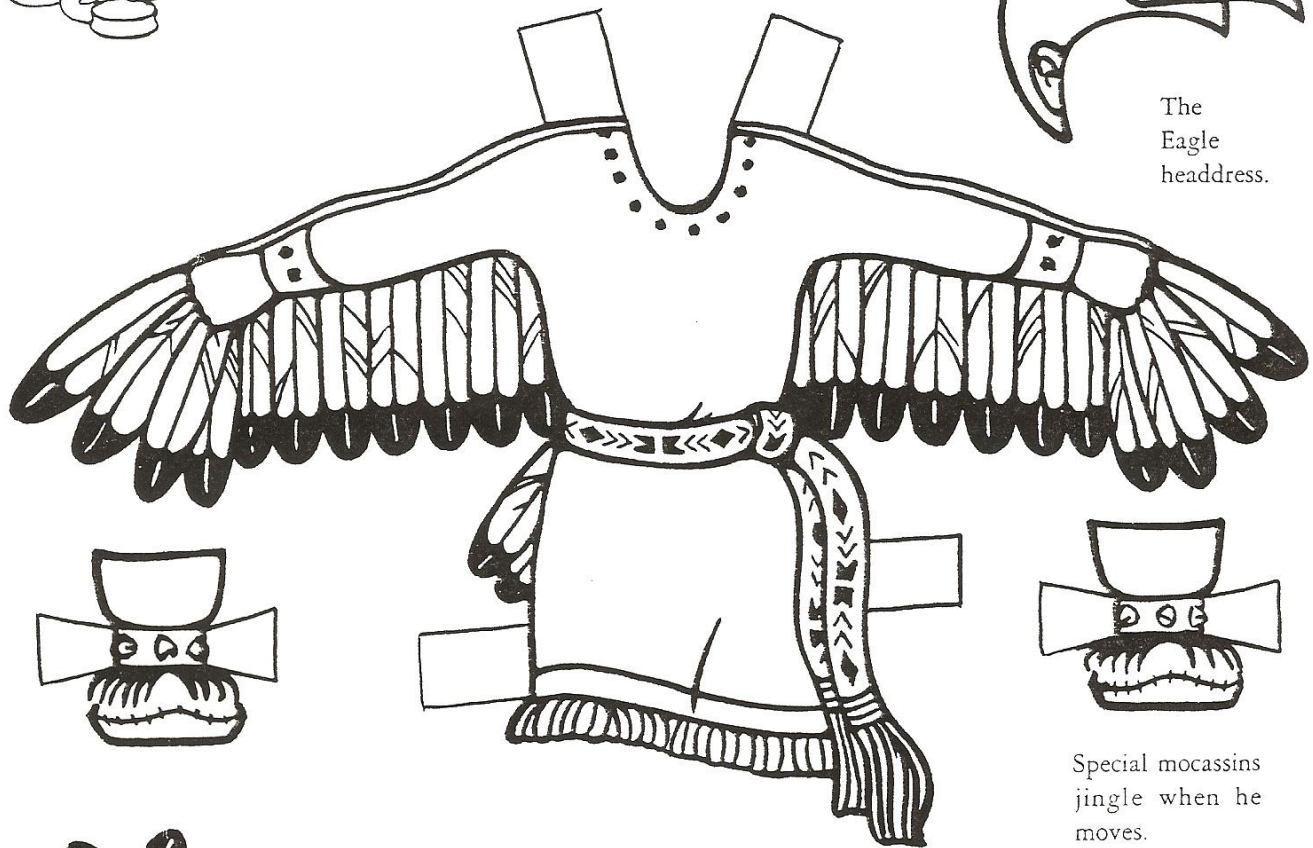


"Swift Runner" is the name of this Pueblo Indian boy who lives in New Mexico.

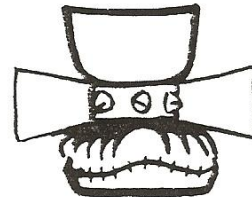
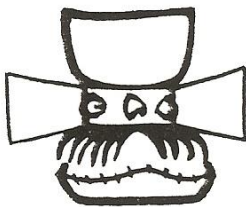

*After you cut out this figure, print ARTURO from ARGENTINA on back.*

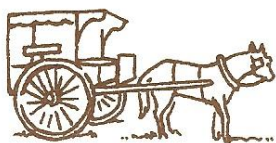


Maté (mah-tay) is a favorite drink. It is like tea and is made in little kettles with hot water. Gauchos make this even when they are out in the fields.

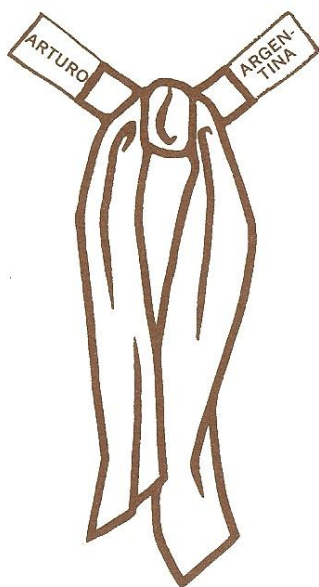
This is ARTURO who lives on a little ranch in ARGENTINA.



"Puchero" is Arturo's favorite stew.



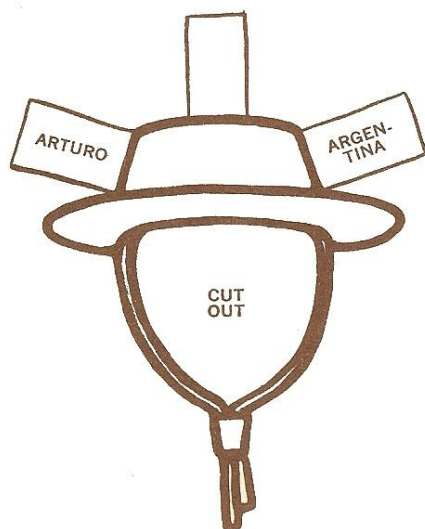
## ARGENTINA

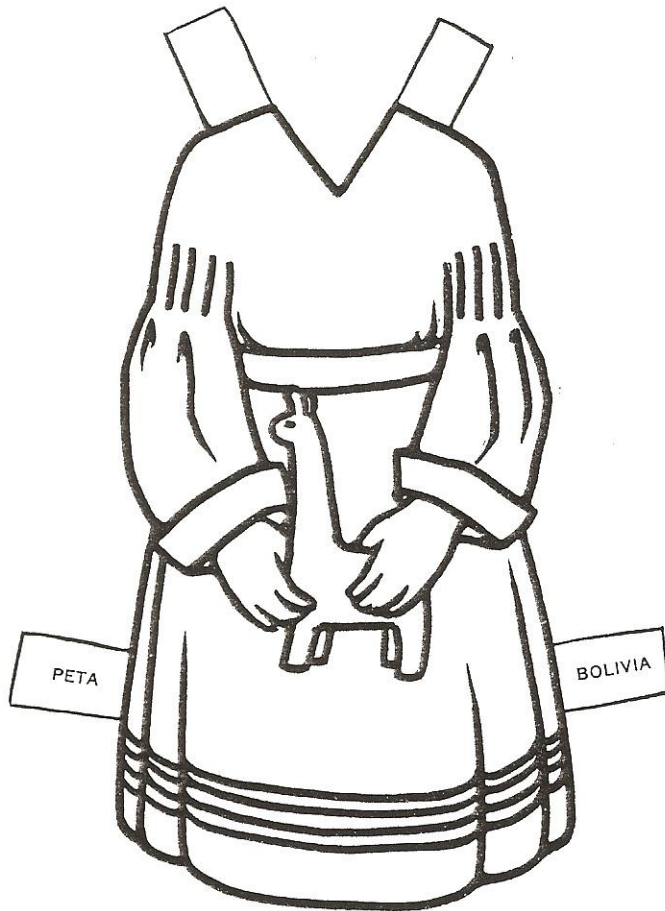


Arturo's home is made of handmade bricks, covered with plaster. Cut out and stand on its place on the map.





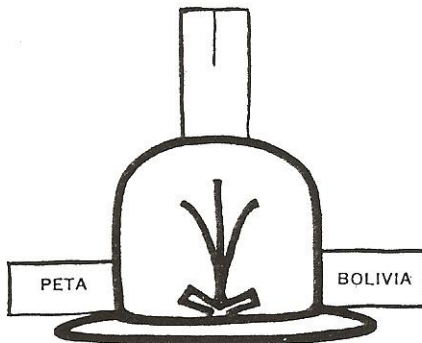

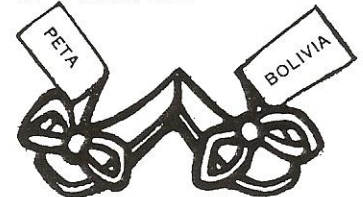


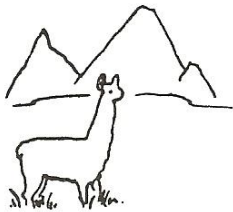
Peta's clothes are warm because it is very cold when the sun goes down. She has a toy llama.



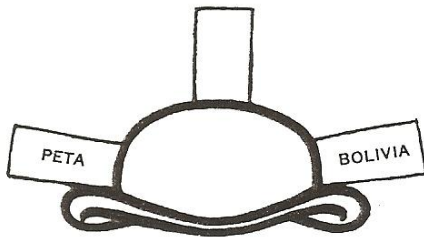
This hat is white straw for summer time.

PETA (PAY-tah) lives high in the mountains of BOLIVIA.

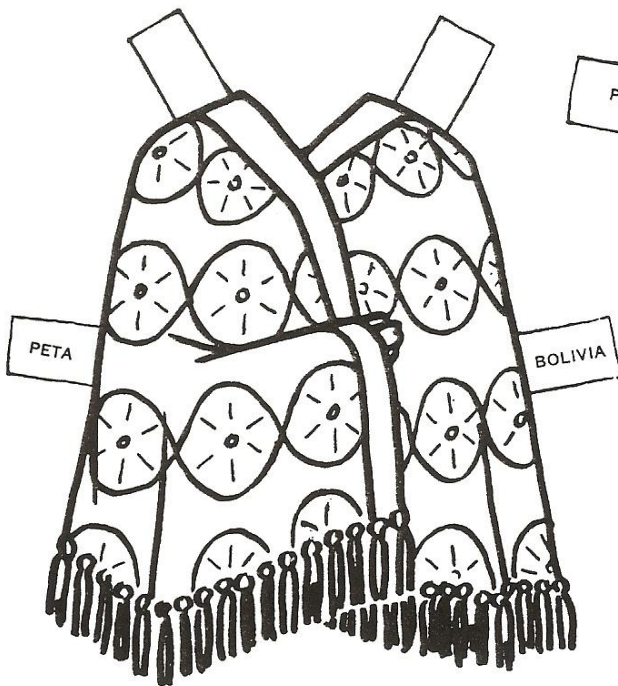




## BOLIVIA

Peta lives in a small house made of adobe (a-DOE-be), which is large blocks of clay and straw.

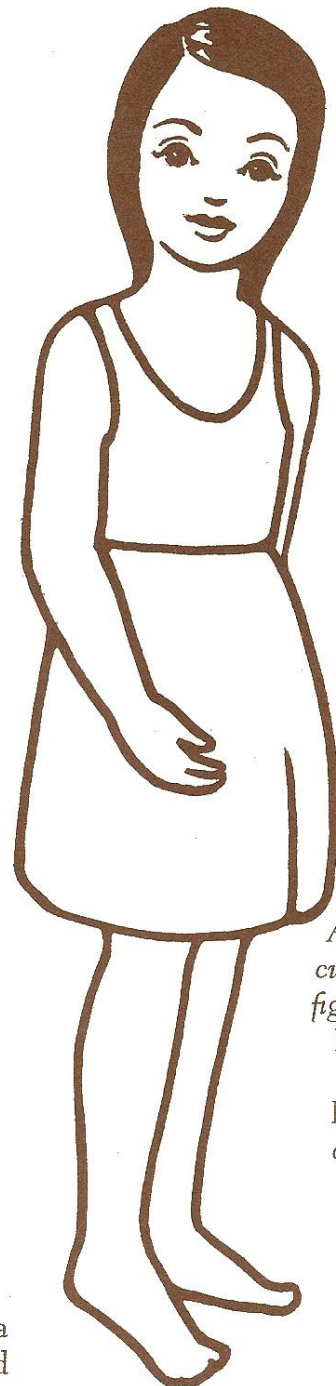

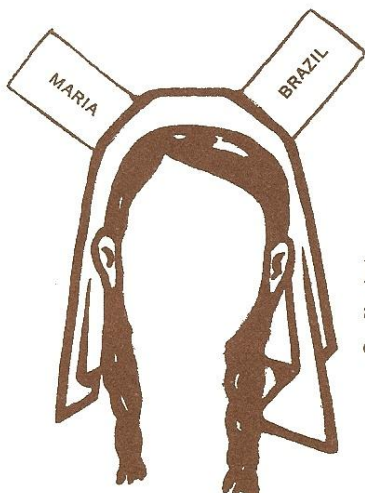

Maria picks coffee berries which are bright red when they are ripe.



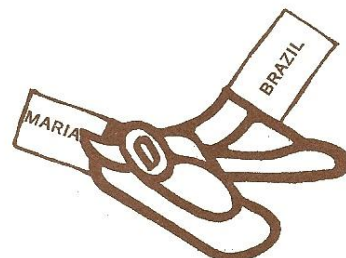

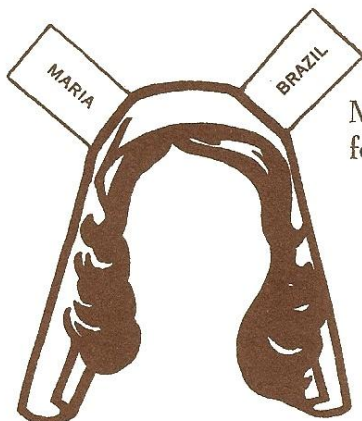

This is Maria's party dress for very special days.



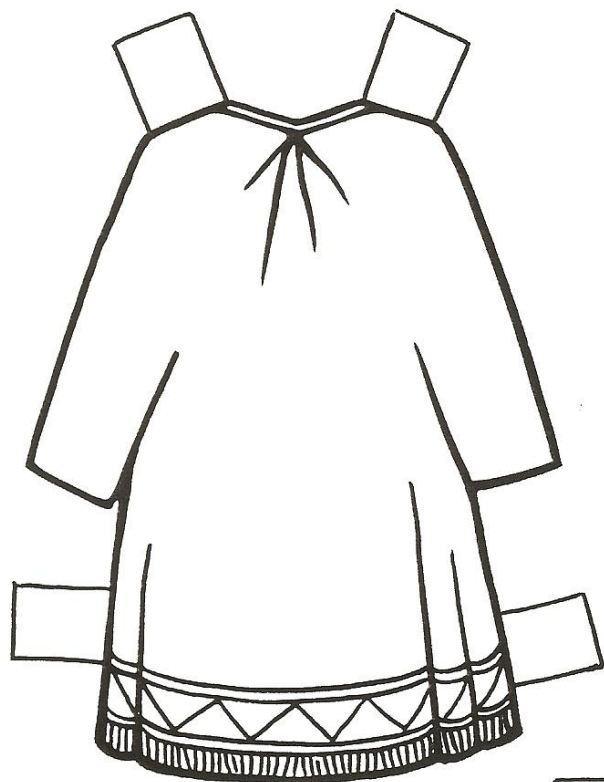

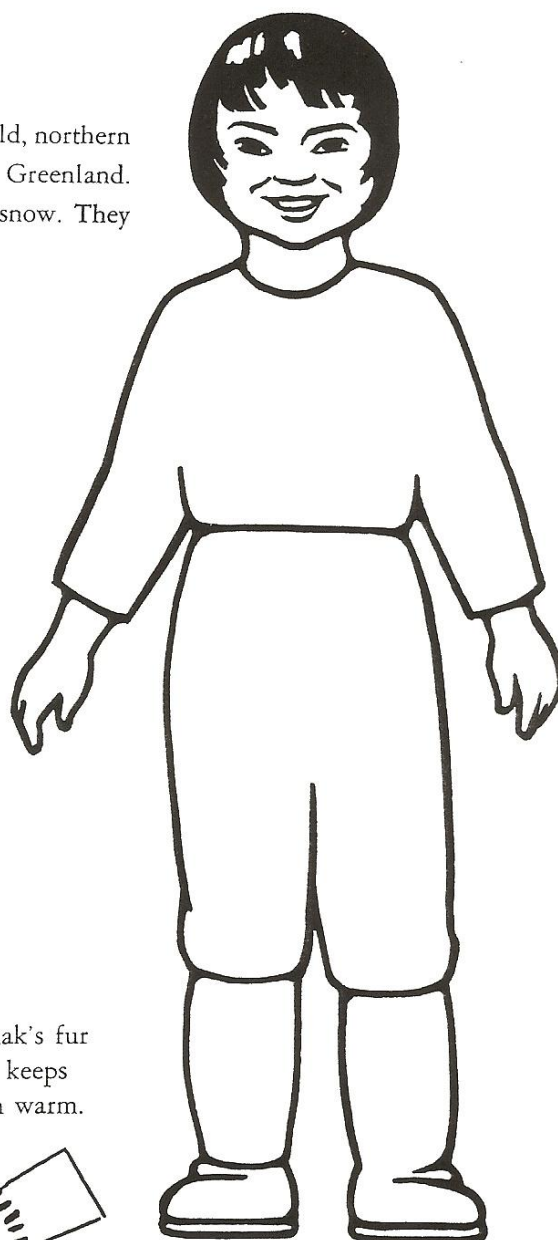
Maria's sturdy house is made of brick with concrete over it. It is light yellow with red tile roof.

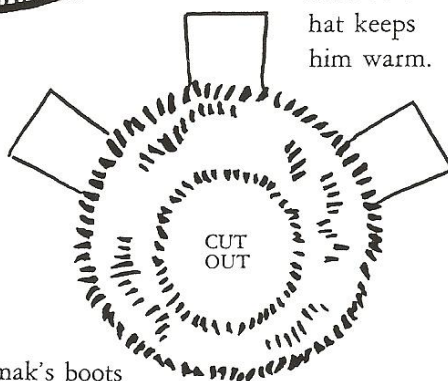

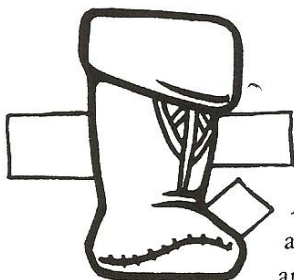
Amak's coat has soft warm fur on the inside.



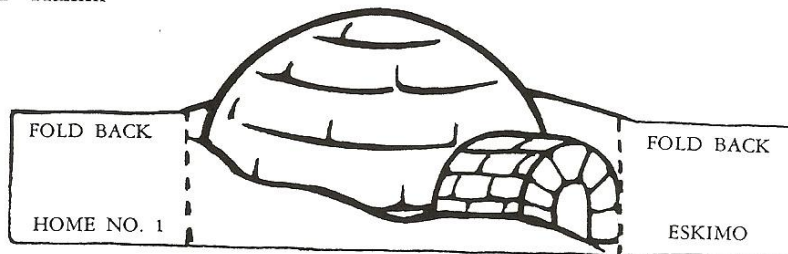
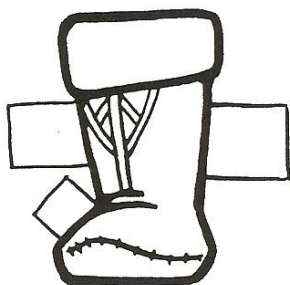
This is Amak, an Eskimo boy.



Amak's fur hat keeps him warm.

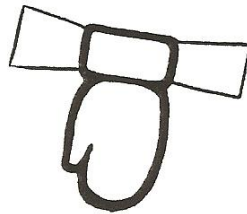
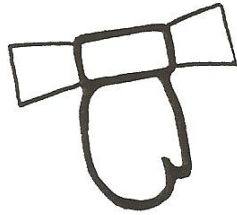


Amak's boots are called "Kamik" and are made of sealskin.

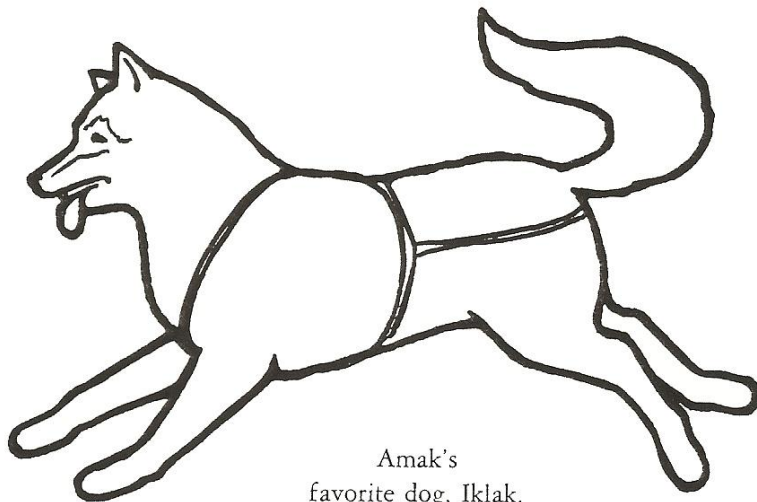


Amak's home is made of snow blocks and is called an igloo. *Cut out and stand on its place on the map.*

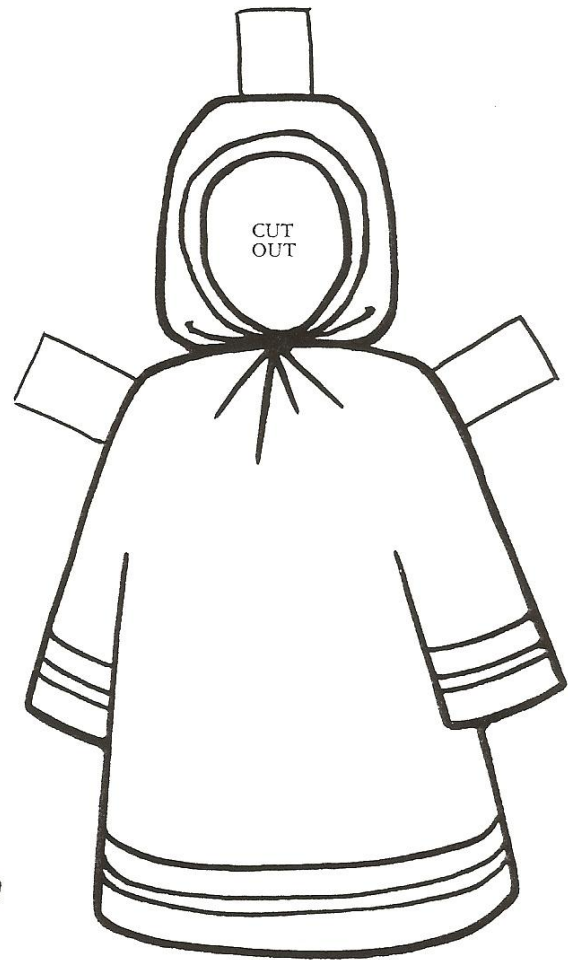

Amak needs strong leather mittens.



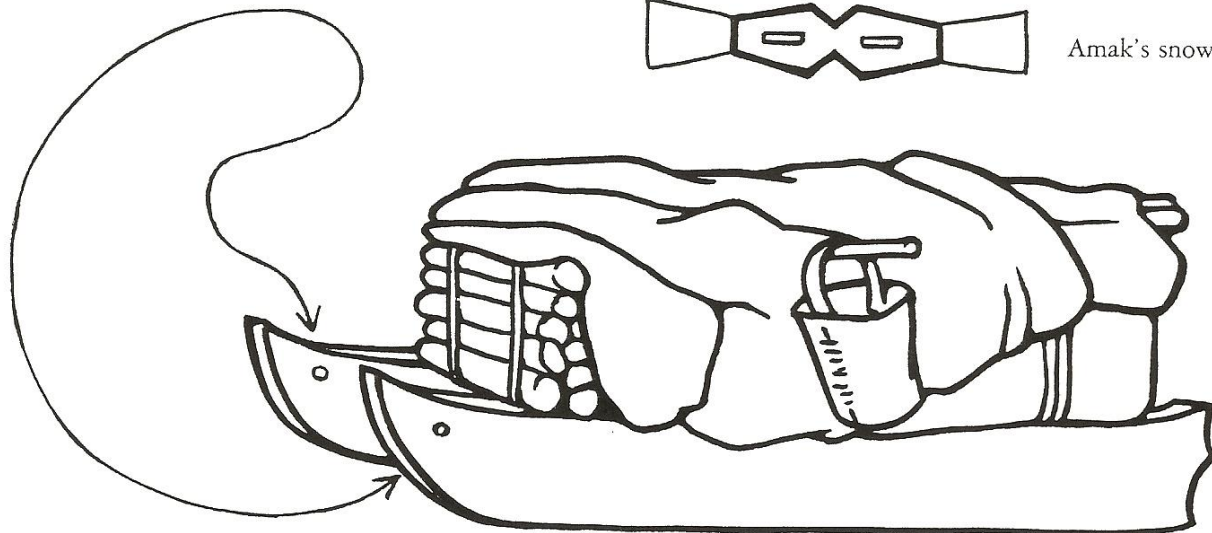
Amak's favorite dog, Iklak.

*Make little round holes in runners of sled. Tie string in holes and put into Amak's hand or around dog.*





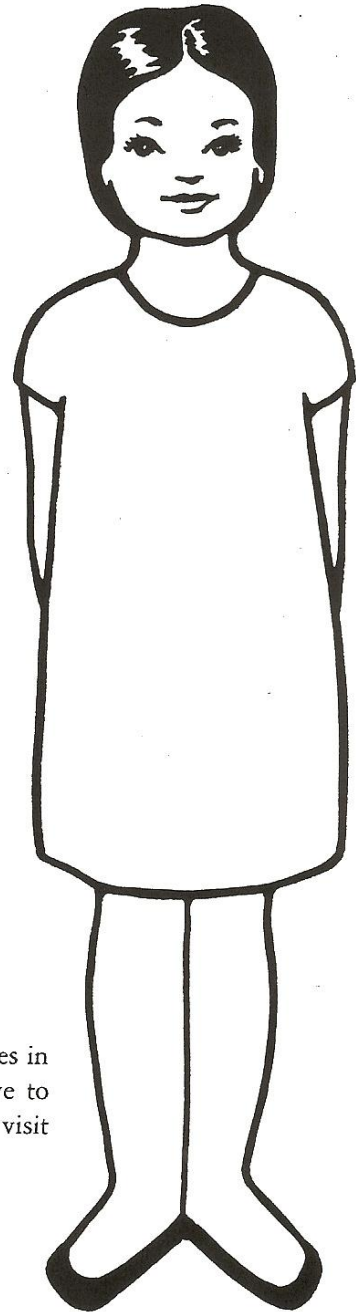
The **INDIANS** live in **INDIA** far away across the sea. They need to be told about Jesus. Many Indians don't know that Jesus is always with them and will always take care of them.

An Indian necklace and bracelet.

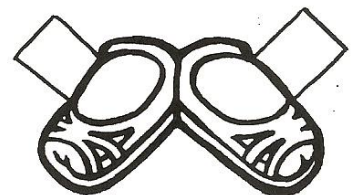


This is Indira who lives in India. We would have to travel a long way to visit her.



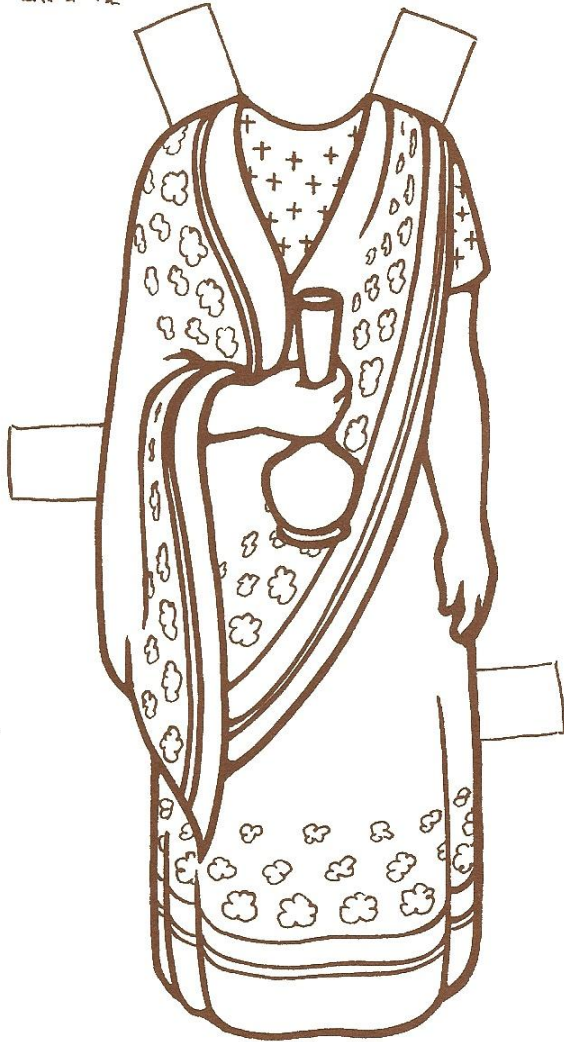
Indira lights a little lamp.

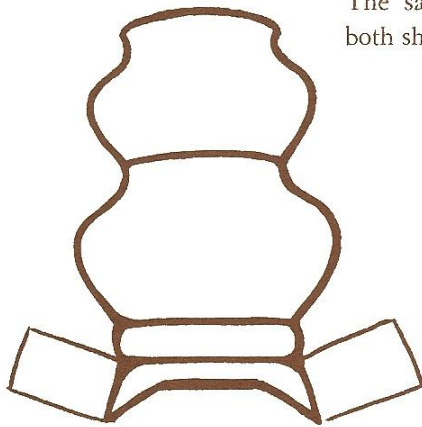

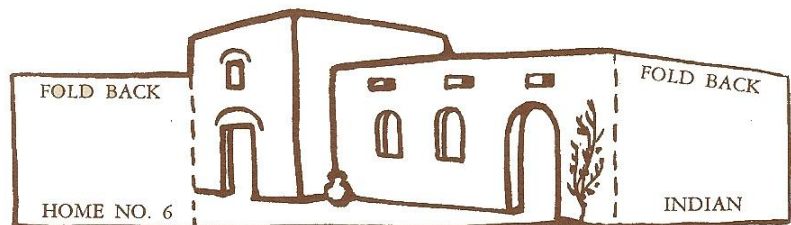
The sari is sometimes draped over both shoulders.

Indira can carry two water pots on her head.



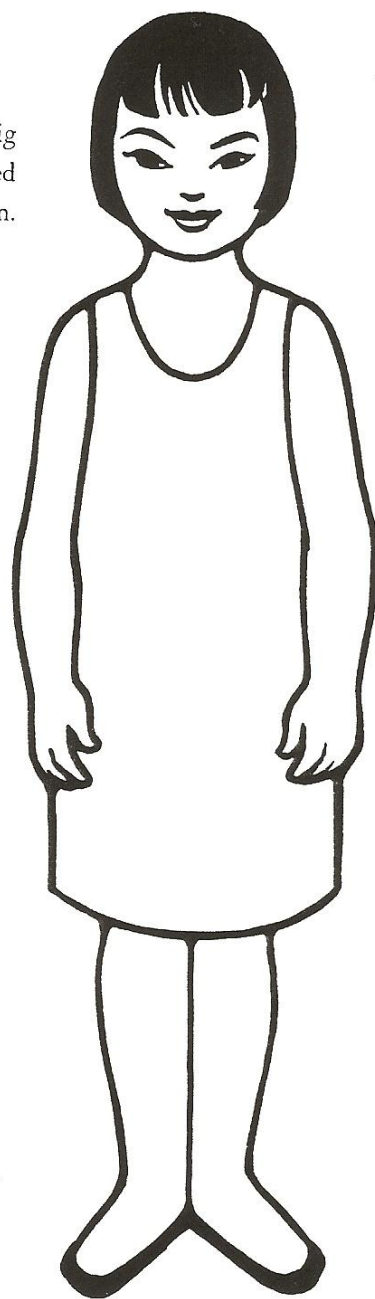
Indira lives in a village with many other people. Her house is made of clay and wood. Whole families live in one room. *Cut out and stand on its place on the map.*



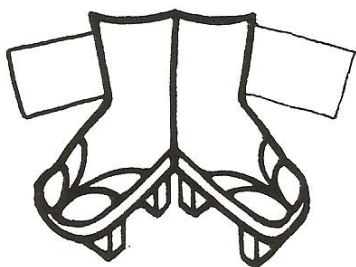
The JAPANESE people live on a big island far away across the sea. They need to know Jesus and how he cares for them.



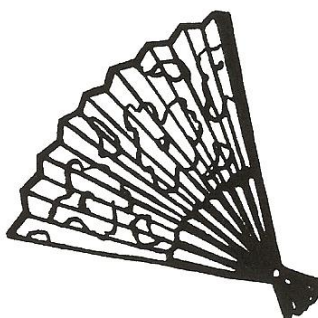
This is one of Mitsuki's dresses called a kimono. The colorful sash is called an "obi."

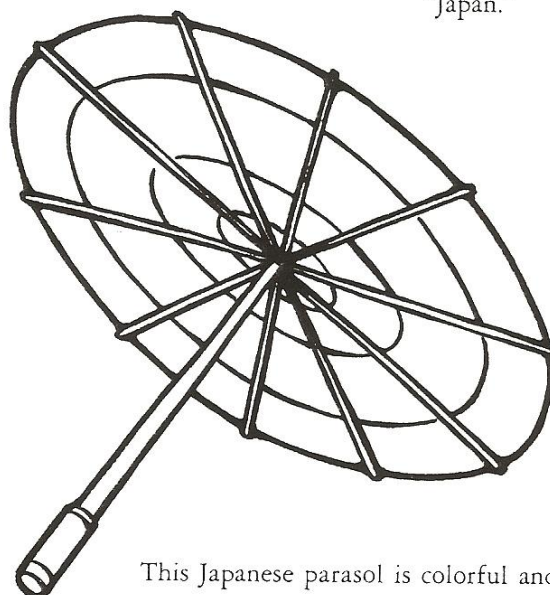
Mitsuki wears her hair in a special way when she gets dressed up.



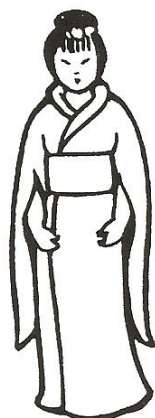
This is how she writes the word "Japan."



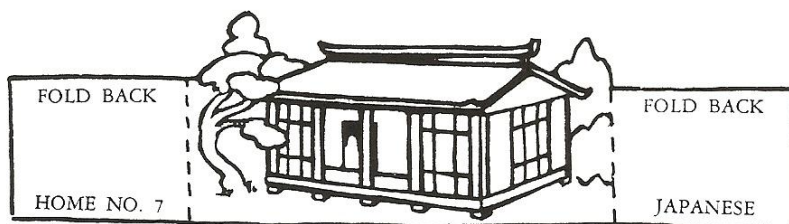
Mitsuki's best kimono has beautiful embroidery on it.

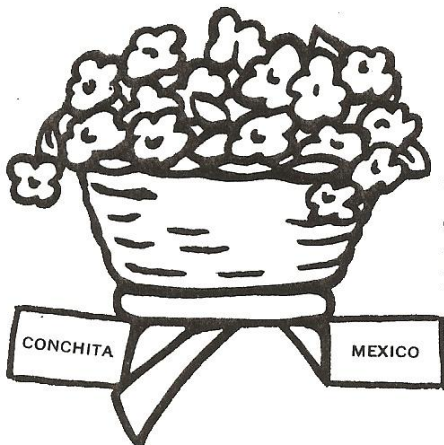

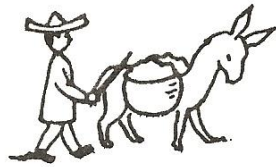

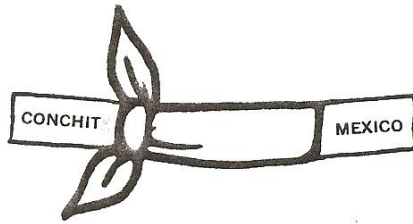
Conchita can carry a big load on her head. She balances it perfectly and it makes her walk nice and straight.

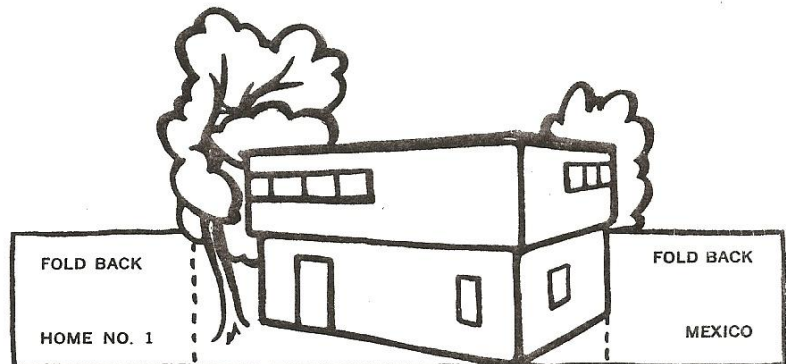
Conchita's blindfold.



The Piñata



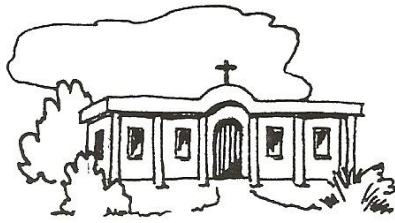

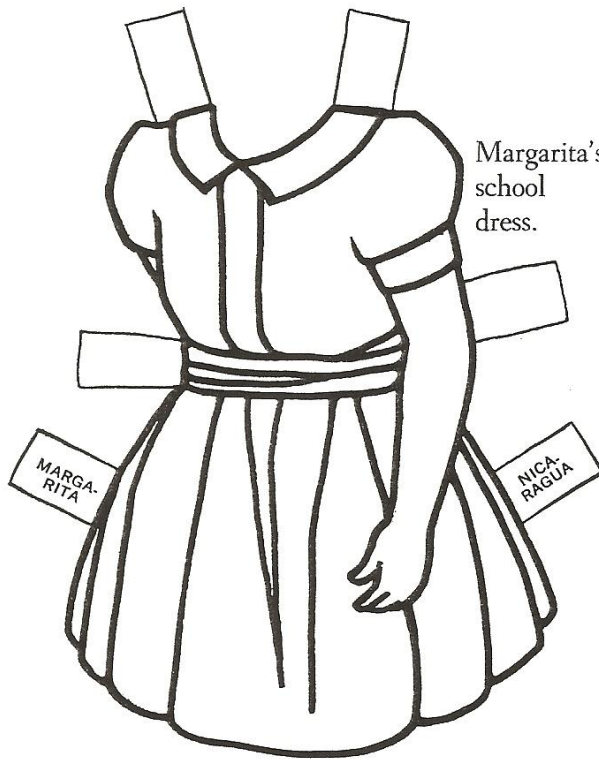
Conchita's house was built only a few years ago. It is white stucco and has a nice garden in the back.

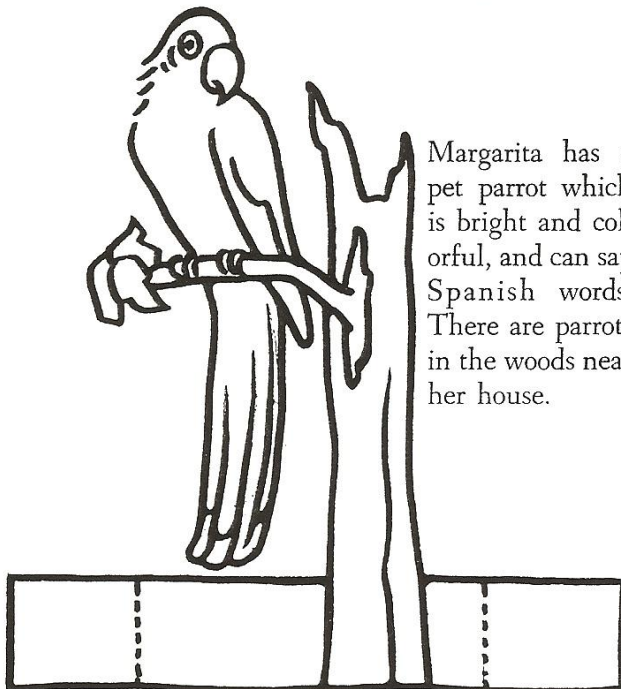
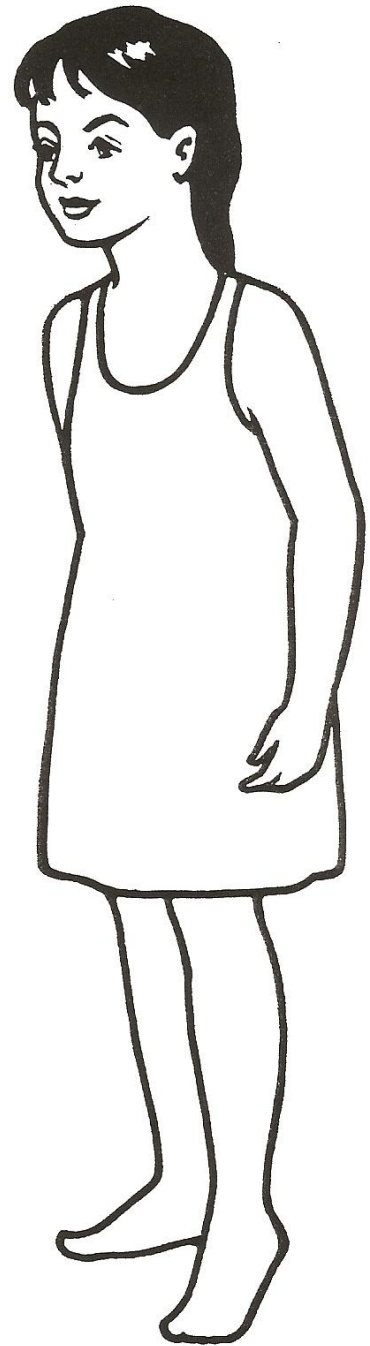

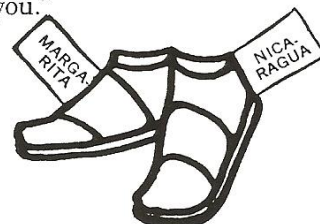
Margarita's school dress.

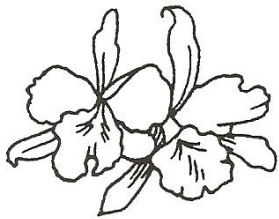
After you cut out this figure, print MARGARITA from NICARAGUA on back.

MARGARITA speaks Spanish. She says "Gracias" (GRAH-see-ahss), which means, "Thank you."



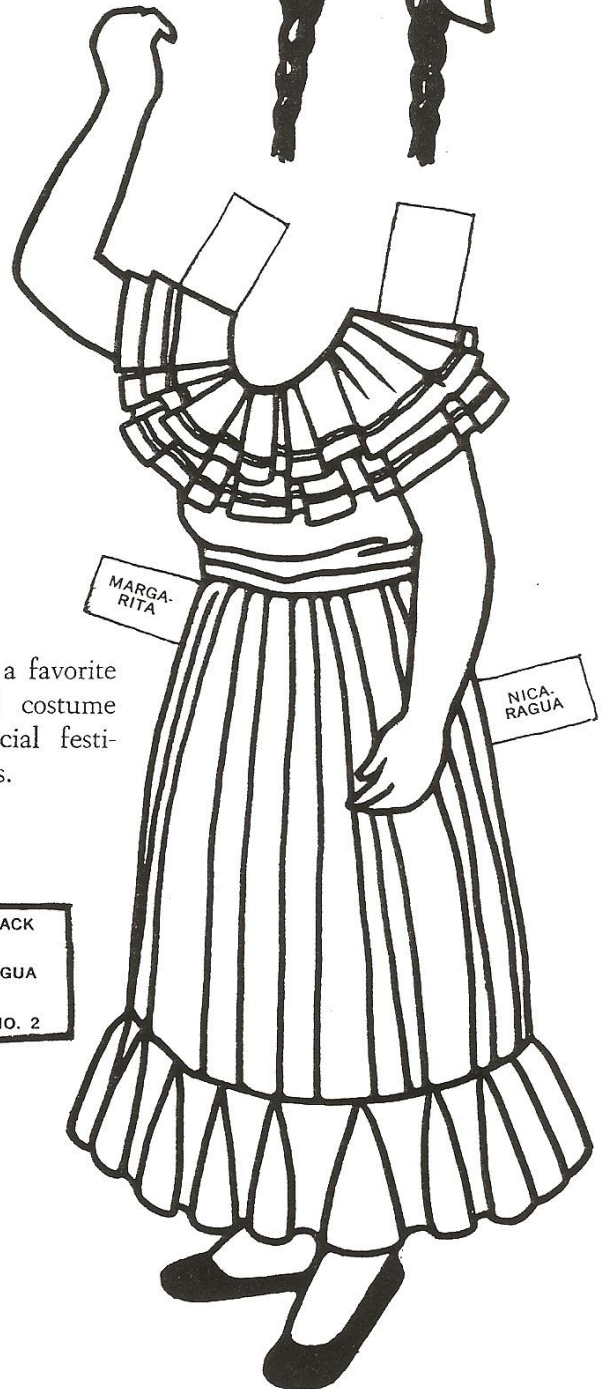
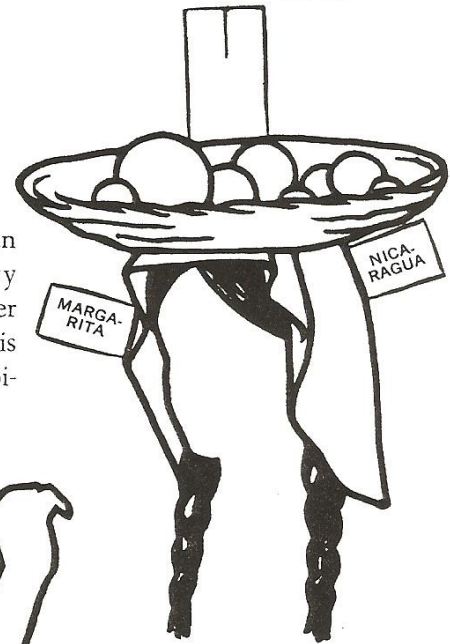


## NICARAGUA

This is a favorite colorful costume for special festival days.

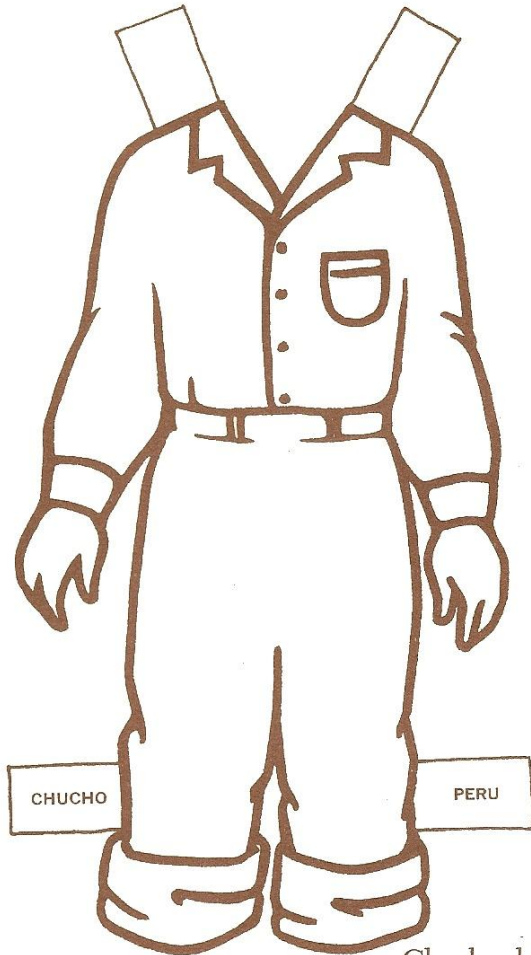


Margarita's home is built right up to the sidewalk with no lawn in front. Inside is a beautiful patio with trees and flowers.

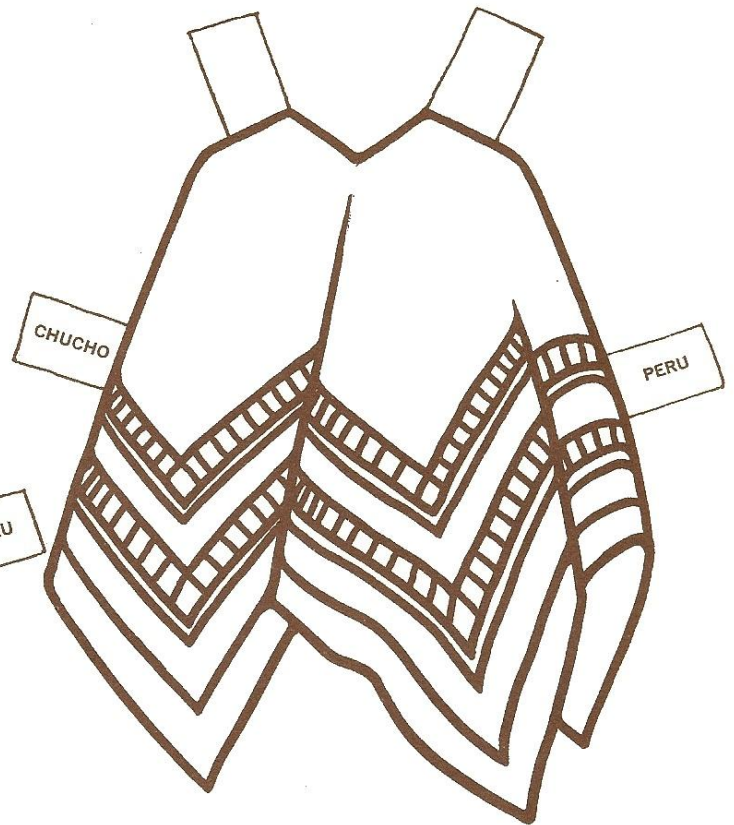
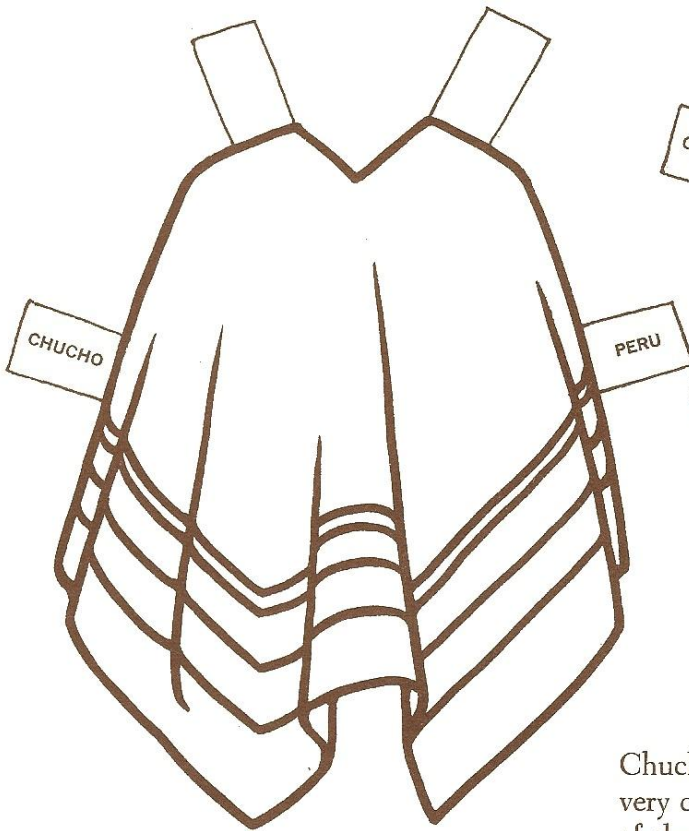
CHUCHO is a Quechua (Ketch-wa) Indian and lives high in the mountains of PERU.



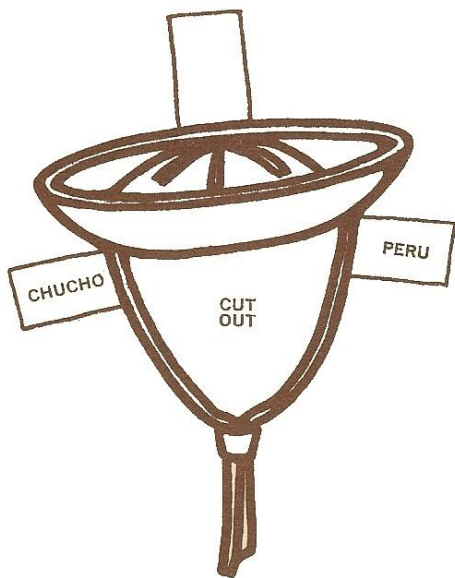




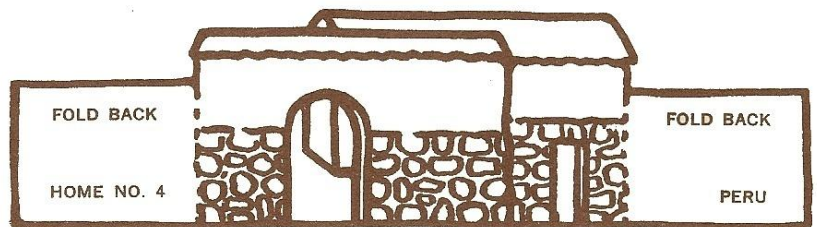
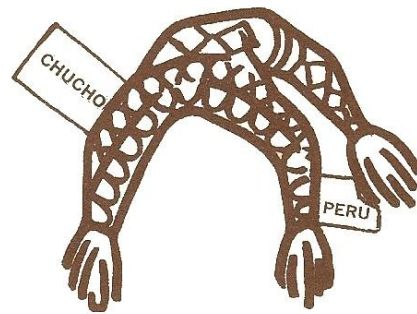

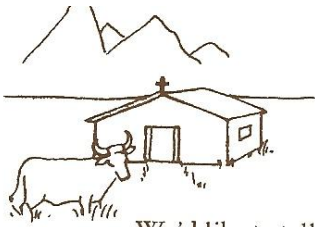
Chucho's ponchos are warm because it becomes very cold at night, even in summer. They are made of sheep's wool or llama's wool.



Chucho's mother made this woolen hat which is full of bright colored designs.

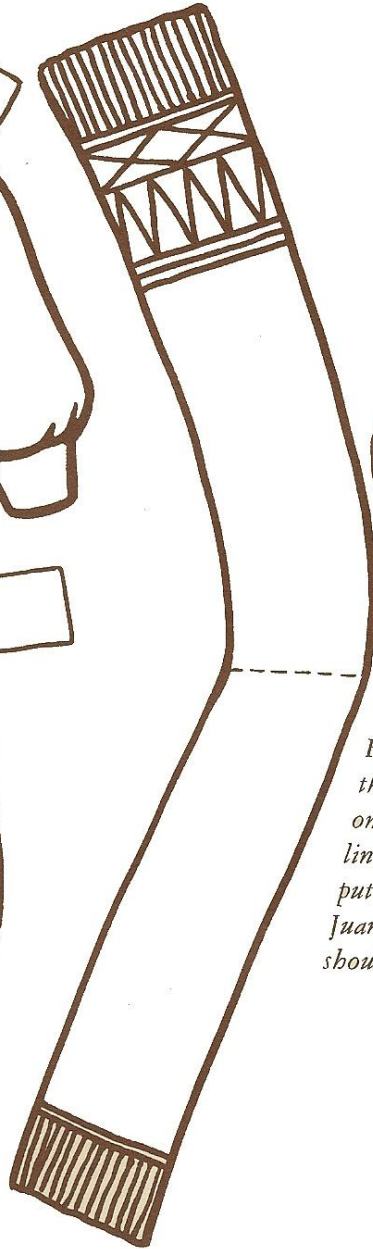
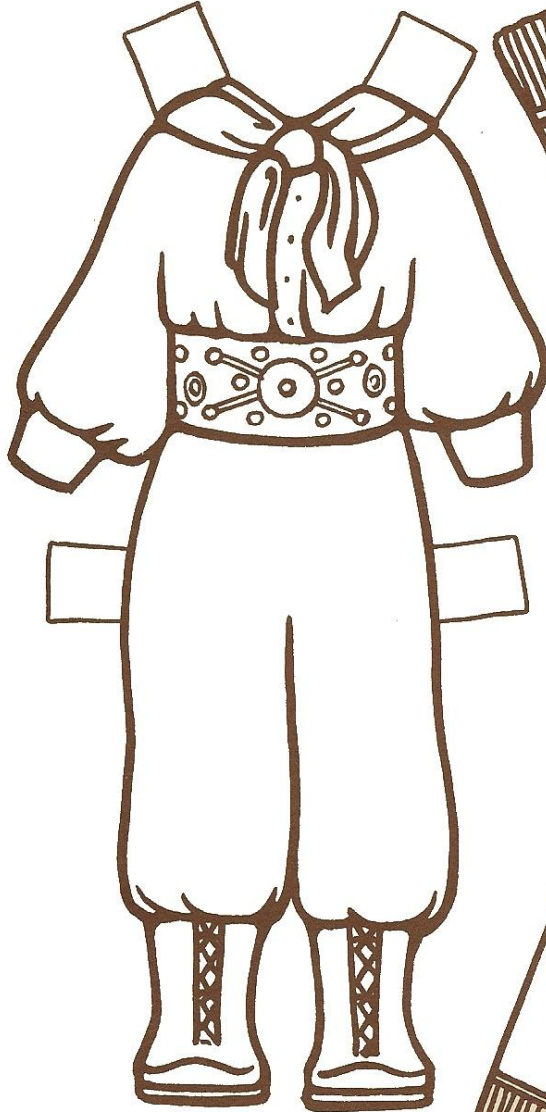

**SOUTH AMERICAN** people are divided into many different countries. In one place, URUGUAY, the people have ranches with many cows.

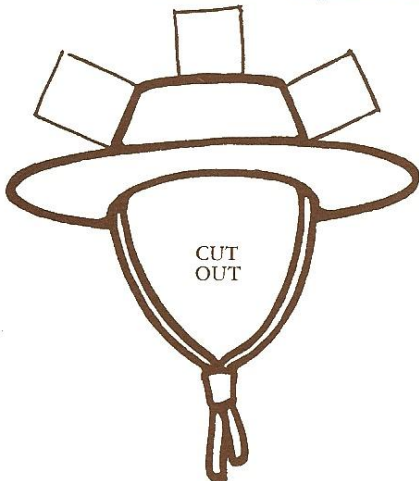
We'd like to tell all the South Americans about Jesus.
